

LEVEL 5 Edge DMZ/Internet

- The enterprise network edge to the internet
- Usually contains corporate firewalls, email, web pages, etc.

LEVEL 4 Enterprise

- Supports the business units
 - Management, HR, Sales
- Usually what we think about as a business network

- 3.5 was added to the original model to address security concerns
- Provides a clearly defined network edge Properly configured DMZ should house between the business networks and OT networks
- DMZ layer Not originally included, layer This zone is typically the place where rules are established so no device from the OT network directly connects to the IT network and vice-versa
 - applications such as Data Historians, MES systems, patch and update servers, etc.

- Managing production workflow
- Manufacturing Execution/Operations Management Systems (MES/MOMS)
- Batch Management
- Data historians and related middleware

LEVEL 2 Supervisory Control

- Supervising, monitoring and controlling physical processes
- Real-time controls and software
- DCS
- Human Machine Interface (HMI)
- Supervisory Control and Data Acquisition (SCADA) software

LEVEL 1 Local Control

- Sensing and manipulating physical processes
- Process sensors
- Analyzers
- Actuators and related instrumentation
